THE INTERVIEW It'll be hard!



member of the grand jury, Dave Whitt a communicatory sciences professor, is one of the first festival guest to have arrived in Karlovac. We caught up with Dave as soon as he arrived to town and decided to relax and go sight seeing.

What do you do?

I'm a professor at an university. I tech communicatory sciences, and one of my classes is based on the art of film. I try to teach my students how to appreciate films as a form of art and how to analyse it based on the theme, colours of the style the director used. Also, we often talk about the history of film making, and we will have a lecture on that during the Festival.

Introduce your lecture!

The theme will be the history of film making, how important it is to know it and appreciate it. Young people today spend a lot of time watching TV and movies, but the know very little about old movies and foreign ones. That's why I'll try to explain why black and white movies or silent ones are not something we should be afraid of because if you want to make a film and work in that world it is very vital to know its history.

Are there any rumours about our Festival?

I heard that the organisation and the quality of the films applied is great. Therefore I hope the films applied will vastly vary in themes they cover and I feel it is going to be particularly interesting because high school students from all over the world are coming and I will ahve the opportunity to see their

What do you expect,

regarding the themes?

I don't know, and I'm very curious. I came here not knowing hat to expect and I'll keep an open mind to whatever it is the authors I trying to show us.

Have you ever been a member of the jury in a similar festival?

No. never. but I did often write about films. I did a number of reviews for magazines, I wrote books about films so I am acquainted with the process of film analyzing and I'm really looking forward to it.

Do you think it will be a difficult task?

Yes, I do. Actually I hope it will, because I'm expecting to see some fantastic films and i bet that making the final decision will be particularly hard-

You co-authored a few books. What were they about?

They are describing the modern mythology and the ways in which it is connected with SF films. For example. Star Wars- the extent in which the theme is based on mythology, on the story of a hero who never wanted to be one and in the end he becomes one. All of that finds its source in the ancient mythology and these do research on ways in which the myths were used in creating today's video games, films and TV shows. (km)

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ONCE LAUREATES OF YFF, AND TODAY?: DARIO LONJAK

No chemistry, no film

Why is it important for us to watch films?

To give ourselves a break from the wonderful reality and everyday life we live. (laugh)

Mainly we watch them because they are (at least some of them) fun, entertaining, educational, sad, scary and somewhat dumb. They are the easiest way to see the world from somebody else's perspective sans consequences.

First movie encounter?

Probably sometime while I was in primary school. As a kid I was a bit fan of Steven Spielberg and through him I discovered a lot of other directors. I've always been interested in special effects, film make up and other tricks. That is why I became not only a real fan of film but of everything connected to making one.

What were you movie beginnings?

They are connected with the Video group and later on with the Movie Club Karlovac. In 1999 I had an opportunity to be a member of the crew who did a commercial for PPK and ever since then up till I went to the Academy I spent a lot of time at the Movie Club. I started out as an assistant, cinematographer, I edited some movies for my older colleagues and soon I was given a chance to direct my own movie.

Is it hard work..making a film?

Not necessarily, but it's very stressing. The process of making a film is an expensive toy and in the professional sense it is very depended on financing and budget. In other words, if you want to make a more complicated film and you are out of funds you're in for a hell of a ride.

What does your work day look like?

Currently, my work day mainly consists of putting a lot of effort to write something worth reading and filming or doing research on certain material that interests me. I can't really say that at this moment I have a lot of directing work to do, because I'm still at the Academy, but hopefully that will be finished by October. A real job in directing is not very easy to get, in order to make some extra money I work as an assistant on films, commercials

Ivan Kelava (not the goal keeper for Dinamo Zagreb) is a young Croatian producer who already worked on a motion picture. Besides being a colleague he is also a good friend of mine, from the time of our own participation at the youth film revues.

What are you most proud at?

Some of the scripts I wrote, but haven't realised them as yet.

The connection between film and chemistry?

If it weren't for chemistry there would be no films. However in this digital era we are witnessing the extinction of the film role and chemistry in film alongside with it.

Do you like to experiment in your films?

I love experimental films and experimenting in motion pictures. I always thought of that as an uncharted area. I haven't done anything serious with that as yet, but I have some plans regarding that. In my opinion the last experimental film worth seeing was Enter the Void. However, very few will find it to be good.

Is there a film in your past your are not so very proud of?

I am able to see a lot of flaws and sequences that could have been done better in every film I ever made, but that is a problem common to every director in the world. Those who are absolutely happy with what they did are very few and far in between. There is always room for improvement. I can't say that I'm ashamed of something I did. All the films i made are a reflection of my view of the world and way of thinking at that point in my

life. Ofcoure, as in everything, there are ups and down here as well.

Why is violence used in your films?

Violence was, is and probably will always be a part of our surrounding. I'm not a pessimist but the world we live in as seen through my eyes is not a very happy and idyllic place. On the contrary, it is abundant with such atrocities that even the most creative mind couldn't conjure. Film is a very powerful media and in my opinion one of its tasks is to alert people and draw their attention to certain problems, violence being one of them. I find it very unrealistic and naive for people to point fingers at some specially violent movies whilst at the same time those same people turn a blind eye towards everything that not right with the world today. Violence has been present on the world's scene for ages and I can guarantee that the cause of it are not films bud a dozen other factors.

What are you currently working on?

Presently I'm finishing the Academy, a documentary film and a few scripts that I'm planning on entering for the HAVC competition. Also, I will be a first assistant to Kristijan Milić on his new project.

Have your beginnings here in Karlovac affected your work substantially?

Quite a bit actually. Besides the practical, technical knowledge about film, the Movie Club has definitely drilled some discipline into me that is to say I learned how to respect a deadline. Also, as film is a product of a collaboration of a number of people, i saw how important communication is. I have also met a lot of my colleagues in the Movie Club.

Are there any differences in today's Karlovac from the one you shot in a film few years ago?

Well, I would say that the interstate helped with the traffic jams, and visually at least the town is different. There are a few new buildings, but all in all I'm quite sure i could make the exact same remake.

Are we going to see something completely new at Dubovac?

My last film is called The Contract. It was a graduation work done by a young producer Marina Trandler and it looks to me as if it is a success. The film still lacks a finishing touch in the photography department, and we thought on doing that in September in Slovenia, so unfortunately it won't be done till its showing on Dubovac. Still it will be the world premiere of the film, and the director's cut no less. (laugh)

Some of your early works will be shown at Dubovac. Any comments?

A lot of critics find one of my first works "Selo moje malo" to be the best I ever made. I on the other hand think that there has been some improvement. It never particularly mattered to me whether the audience likes what I did. I make the kind of films i would love to see. Every praise is additional motivation but the film Academy has definitely thought me one thing - go with your instinct and thus I will be happy with what I do. On the other hand I'm glad that 3 out of 4 films that will be shown have at least partially been made here in Karlovac.

Top 5 films

Well, the list changes every year, depending on my mood swings. Taxi driver, The Godfather 2, Pusher trilogy, Irreversible, and one other that isn't a film, but is more of a film than many others- The Sopranos season 6.

Something to recommend?

Kynodontas - an excellent Greek movie, Cannes and Montreal Grand prix Winner that even had an Oscar nomination. (sv)
