## I've yet to hear from only the North and the South Pole!

CHATTING WITH THE PROGRAMME COORDINATOR

Tonight, the Festival will begin- for most of you this will be the first time you're seeing the films in the running. Needles to say, the applications for the Festival began a long, long time ago, long before we even knew who the members of the selection committee were going to be- you know the people who were charged with the task to decide which of the 307 films applied will get a chance to be one of the 80films in the running.

However, there is one person who spent her time talking on the phone

and exchanging facebook messages all around the world. We give you, both the Festivals and the Reviews programme coordinator- Sanja Zanki.

First thing's first though, what does one do as a programme coordinator?

"Gathers films!" - she laughs and continues - "The story actually begins with me typing the words "youth film festival" into facebook search, check out the reaping it produced and I'm on a roll. I send them messages telling that we are organising a youth festival and that we would like if they could/would send us their film/films. Some of them then send me their applications. For example, this year I spend a number of nights chatting with this guy from the Philippines. It took a while but in the end he sent his film. We also have a data base from the festivals we cooperate with and then they also send us some of the works. Well, you could say that my iPad is my best friend during the process of film collecting." All of this sounds rather complicated but Sanja

assures us it's actually great fun, the downside being the loneliness factor- "When you work you have to do it alone. One has a certain time frame for calling people, texting them and generally trying to persuade them to send their film, for example from 6 to 10pm, when it's polite to intrude someone's personal time. The complicated part is keeping track of what you have written and to whom, whom you're expecting to hear from etc. That is why my little black book is always with me. In it I keep track of those who turned me down, those whom I've turned down and of course those whom with I have organised our cooperation."

And that is where your job ends? "Noooo, that is when the fun begins. After doing all of this we have to see which of the films applied suit our criteria. I often hear from slightly older film maker and them I have to turn down. Finally, in the end, when the selection committee has decided which of the films applied are in for the running- I have to make out the final details with the authors- sometimes they need to send better quality versions of the film, send the films to get subtitles etc. Having done that I can say my work is done."

Sanja has been with the Festivals since its beginnings 7 years ago. What did it look like back then?

"I remember the first Four River Film Festival, when, truth be told, we could only call it a regional festival, since the international part of it were mostly films from Serbia and Slovenia. And now, I did a little statistics and I can see the Faroe Islands, Philippines, more than 30 countries."

Sanja is probably the reason why our data base has grown so much in size, especially now that we have finally crossed that magical number of 300 films applied.

"I think I only haven't contacted the North and the South Pole, although Tromso and South African Republic are very close" (ds)



THE JURY UNDER A MAGNIFYING GLASS:

## To live and breathe film festivals!

**How and when have you heard about the Four River Film Festival for the first time? Why have you decided to accept the invitation after all?**

The first time I heard about this Festival was two years ago. That was when Marija Ratković came to study at the Wayne State College and she told me all about it. I immediately accepted the invitation upon receiving it. I'm familiar with this type of festival, since I have participated, volunteered and even organized a number of them.

**This role, a member of a jury at a film festival, is not for you. You have already been in these shoes at a youth video competition in Kansas? Do you expect the films here to be different from those of young Americans, topic wise?**

Actually, I sat as a member of the jury on a couple of youth film festivals, but I was most included in the making of the one in Kansas.

Young film makers usually create films which topics range from talking about their interests or problems, some things they feel should be changed. Young Americans are interested in the world around them and through their documentaries are trying to make a difference in it. Some, on the other hand are more interested in re-creating Hollywood blockbusters. However, nowadays in the States, films with a topic related to environment or a social problem are very popular, and it seems to me that young Croatians are also worried about the environment and the state of global economy in general.

**Do you think that an artistic approach to film making is appreciated in the USA? Is there a lot of festivals dedicated to young film makers who are still in high school?**

Festivals, as is yours, are very scarce in the USA, but I must admit smaller communities are recognizing film as a way to infuse the economy of the area and are trying to draw people's attention towards film. So, yes, I would say that there is a steady growth in the level of interest for film festivals.

**You yourself have directed a few films. What are they about and what inspired you to choose those very topics for your films?**

My films are mostly short documentaries, however, in my last film "Highway 12: A Psychological Roadtrip" I did a small turnabout from the world of the documentary film. It's a short narrative film I did with my friends. The film is about a young man who, while walking down an abandoned highway, is trying to solve his problems. Is his experience reality or just a figment of his imagination? I learned a lot from this experience and had a really good

time while making the film.

**What is your favourite film genre? Which ones do you expect to be shown at the Festival?**

My favourite genre is documentary and I also like sarcasm loaded satires. I expect to see films from all the genres, but I'm very interested to see what is new in the free style category. A lot of my students back in the States like to do something we call "video poetry" - those are basically poems defined by the visual art. That is why I'm quite fond of the free style.

**You work as a teacher at Wayne State College. What do you teach and how do the students react to the topics you teach?**

I teach video/audio production, the media and the media ethics. I'm very proud to



be able to say that students from various fields of education attend my classes and are interested in filming and making a video. In the USA, if you want to move up the ladder in your professional life you have to be up to date with all brand new technology and communication.

**Do you think that you will have a hard time in deciding upon the winner of the Festival?**

I think that making the final decision will be very hard indeed, since I always look for the best in everyone's work. I always try to find and recognize the effort one has put into one's work. That is why I'm very honoured to be a part of the Four River Film Festival.

## Keeping company with the film

The pole for hosting this year's European Festival on Youth Film Making came to Karlovac all the way from the deep north of Norway, from Tromsø.

Alongside the Festival and the Review, the yellow crew took upon them the organization of the seminar. The seminar was opened on Sunday at the Micro cinema located at Gimnazija Karlovac.

Marija Ratković Vidaković welcomed the guests and represented Croatia as a land from which the pen, the tie and the parachute originate. The main sponsor of this event is a youth movement "Youth in the act!" and Matej Kečkeš told us something about them. The socializing lasted long into the night assisted by a traditional specialty - rakija. The following day at the City Museum the participants of the

seminar gave short presentations of their Festivals.

Rhiannon Wyn Hughes of the Scala International Youth Film Festival and Berkant Erdem from Teen International Film Festival were the first to share their thoughts with us,

**B: It's my first time here in Karlovac, in Croatia actually, and I think it's a lovely town, small, it's very refreshing after Istanbul, since it's 20 million people living there.**

**R: It's absolutely fabulous, and I was just so pleased to be invited, because, as I said before, we are very much at the beginning, and the international partners that we are linked with have been so generous, they have more developed festivals, bigger festivals, and they helped us a lot with enhancing our own festival. So I am very grateful to the generosity of our international partners and I hope that we'll continue to develop together.**

...and they gave a short presentation about their festivals for the readers of the The Daily Bottle...

**B: The festival is interesting, we have a huge programme, we screen over 300 films, it lasts for 5 days, so 5 days of films and 5 days of partying. Plus we have a lot of side events, like discussions and workshops.**

**R: Well, it's quite a new festival, but we have a fabulous new cinema that we're using. But it's been very much born out of the young people that have been coming every week to our media suite and learning how to make films. And we've started linking with youth festivals in Wales this year which will enable us to have a national festival so the young people will be mixed together from different parts of Wales, as well as internationally.**

...and told us how to go about opening a cinema in our town...

**R: When we were building a new cinema, we were a million pounds short to actually build it. So the town came out to the local council to borrow a million pounds. And it's going to be paid back over the next 20 years by the local residents, which means that every resident gives about two or three pounds every year for the next 20 years.**

Three hundred films shown in 5 days time and paying off an entire cinema in 20 years? We were left speechless and it took us some time to set our balance back in order - we confess - local specialities helped in our speedy recovery.
